The Public meeting on the 20th October was discussed, M Ryan thought that the people were becoming more engaged and forming a community identity with the Neighbourhood Plan. J Howells and P Behrens will collate the evidence from the questionnaires from the public meeting. M Ryan asked if some of the questions could be simplified before J Howells emails them out to the steering group to fill in and pass on to neighbours and friends within the Parish.

A Kidd asked if St Hilary granite should be used as a construction material in the Neighbourhood Plan.

Kath Statham has nearly finished the LLCA and is waiting for some input from the steering group which J Howells will follow up. J Howells reported that the LLCA promotes the Parish very well.

The need for a Project Manager was discussed, in order to apply for a Project Manager cost the name of a Project Manager must be included in the grant bid.

Settlement areas were highlighted at Relubbus and Rosudgeon with the lane by the school considered, the areas would need to have transport links and local services nearby. M Ryan asked if Rosudgeon could be prioritised as a settlement area.

If anyone has questions for Sarah Furley could forward them on to D Reed for compiling into one document and forwarding on.

An informal drop in meeting for the draft NDP for discussion and consultation before the referendum was agreed. Fliers could be sent to every household in the parish and adverts in the local paper to view the NDP online, problems could possibly arise from people not being able to view or be informed of the NDP.
