Proposal – St Hilary Neighbourhood Development Plan

Details – St Hilary Parish Council has submitted its proposed Neighbourhood Development Plan to Cornwall Council for public consultation and independent examination. The plan area covers the Parish of St Hilary. The Gears Lane area is included in policies in the Perranuthnoe Neighbourhood Development Plan. The St Hilary Neighbourhood Development Plan includes policies on housing, local green spaces, character, community facilities, transport, economy, parking and sustainability. Once made, these policies will be used to determine planning applications locally along with the Cornwall Local Plan.

Consultation on the submission (Regulation 16) version of the Neighbourhood Development Plan is taking place from **Monday 22 January 2024 – Monday 4 March 2024 midnight**. All representations received from this consultation will be made available to an independent examiner, appointed to examine the Neighbourhood Development Plan.
